Top Five Emerging Search Terms

(Ranking based on search terms having the biggest movement within the top 100 search terms since December 31, 2007.)

- 1. Tilapia not in the top 100; moved to 22
- 2. Muffins not in the top 100; moved to 35
- 3. Fish not in the top 100, moved to 40
- 4. Chicken breast not in the top 100, moved to 42
- 5. Soups not in the top 100, moved to 44

Top Five Decreasing Search Terms

(Ranking based on search terms with the biggest drop in searches among the top 100 search terms since December 31, 2007.)

- 1. Breakfast casserole moved from 7 to 89
- 2. Sugar cookies moved from 3 to 85
- 3. Punch moved from 23 to 86
- 4. Turkey moved from 39 to 96
- 5. Scalloped potatoes moved from 43 to 82

True to form, as indulgent holiday feasts become history or bulges on the hips, cooks turn toward simpler, more healthful dishes, adding fish and chicken back to their diets. Cold weather across the country and comfort food cravings also motivate January recipe searches. Slow cookers are popular for pot roast, and everyone again has time to make lasagna.

Healthy Resolutions

This January tofu makes it into the list of top five healthful ingredient search terms! Getting fit in the New Year is desirable—for the first week of January anyway, then the curve starts sloping downwards.

- Top diet-related search terms (low-fat and low-carb) surged 220 percent over December to peak on January 2.
- Even after the peak, there has been a 110 percent increase in traffic to the healthy channel in the past two weeks compared with December 2007.

When it comes to dieting, the tried and true remain top of mind. No new fad diet is surging across consumer radar this winter, but losing pounds fast and sensibly is perennially popular as the South Beach and Dash Diets (designed to combat hypertension) searches indicate—and no one really wants to stop eating cookies, cake or desserts. Maybe, just maybe there's a diet version?

Love Is In the Air

Valentine's Day is right around the corner. According to a recent Allrecipes online survey about users' plans and desires for the year's sweetest day, cooking dinner with a loved one is the best way to spend Valentine's Day. Based on 825 responses:

- 81 percent of users polled are planning to stay in this Valentine's Day, and
 82 percent of this group will cook a meal.
- 58 percent of users think cooking a meal together is more romantic than going out to a favorite restaurant
- Candles (45 percent), music (22 percent) and chocolate (17 percent) are the biggest must-have items for a romantic evening
- What is the drink of choice this Valentine's Day?
 - Wine 55 percent
 - Mixed drinks 21 percent
 - Champagne 20 percent
 - Martinis 5 percent

Valentine's Day stands out as a singular holiday based on user traffic. Other holidays such as Christmas and Easter show a steady build-up in traffic one to two weeks in advance, and then a 30 to 120 percent decline in traffic on the actual day of the holiday. However, Valentine's Day traffic surges 30 percent on February 12 over the previous day, and remains at this peak through February 14. Dare we say it's (further) evidence that men are notoriously bad planners?

To assist cupid in his mission, menus with aphrodisiac ingredients are arousing interest, a curiosity that's already showing up in January recipe searches.
