What Real People Are Eating and Cooking - March 2008

This report was derived by searching data points among the 17.6 million visits from February 26 through March 24, 2008, and the more than 40,000 recipes currently found on Allrecipes.com.

#### TRENDS OF THE MONTH

#### **Thrifty Cooks**

With an unstable economic landscape, users have been consciously seeking more pocketbook-friendly recipes. Searches for recipes using inexpensive ingredients increased by 91 percent over the past three months. Some of the least-expensive but most-used ingredients include:

- 1. Ground beef
- 2. Pasta
- 3. Rice

#### Budget Dining at Home - Ethnic Restaurant-Style

Instead of spending dough by eating out, users are learning to cook their own ethnic favorites. Searches for "make at home" versions of popular ethnic restaurant dishes have increased significantly. Traffic to the Pizza, Chinese, and Indian recipe collections have increased more than 79 percent over the past three months. Searches for Chinese fare have increased 200 percent, while searches for Indian recipes show a 93 percent increase.

## **Top Five Emerging Search Terms**

Green Eggs and Ham rise to the top! St. Patrick's Day and Easter clearly influenced recipe searches in March. The search terms below showed the biggest movement since February 26, 2008, in the "Top 100 List." (Rankings are based on search terms having the greatest amount of movement among more than 1,000,000 monthly unique search terms used on Allrecipes.)

- 1. Ham moved to 1 from 90
- 2. Deviled Eggs moved to 3 (not in the top 100)
- 3. Egg Salad moved to 5 (not in the top 100)
- 4. Scalloped Potatoes moved to 14 (not in the top 100)
- 5. Turkey moved to 35 (not in the top 100)



## **Top Five Decreasing Search Terms**

With Super Bowl parties and Valentine's Day now history, users abandoned finger foods, sweet treats, and classic pot roast in favor of March holiday fare. (Ranking based on search terms with the biggest drop in searches among the top 100 search terms since February 26, 2008.)

- 1. Sugar Cookies moved to 100 (from 29)
- 2. Appetizers moved to 79 (from 33)
- 3. Cupcakes moved to 91 (from 51)
- 4. Pot Roast moved to 83 (from 44)
- 5. Scallops moved to 91 (from 43)
