What Real People Are Eating and Cooking – May 2008

This report was derived by searching data points among the 14.2 million site visits to Allrecipes.com from April 29 through May 27, 2008, and more than 40,000 recipes. Data was gathered using a combination of in-house tools and Omniture's SiteCatalyst.

TREND OF THE MONTH

Economic Downturn Influences Grocery Shopping Habits

Results of an online survey recently conducted tapped 750 Allrecipes.com households where 90% of the respondents identified themselves as their family's primary grocery buyer. The data was analyzed independently by a third party research group to account for U.S. regional differences, and yielded the following insights:

- o 60% of respondents reported they were spending more on groceries than one year ago
- o 54% were more mindful of grocery prices
- o 32% reported they were preparing more meals at home
- o 22% reported they were buying more store brands

Top Five Emerging Search Terms

Making breakfast or brunch for Mom on her special day was the primary influence on recipes searches in May, along with the inspiring Slow Cooker recipes featured in the redesigned Allrecipes Daily Dish e-newsletter. The terms below showed the most movement on the "Top 100 List" compared on a year-over-year basis since April 29, 2008. (Rankings are based on search terms having the greatest amount of movement among more than 1 million monthly unique search terms used on Allrecipes.)

1. Biscuits – moved to 80 from 98
2. Chicken Casserole – moved to 59 from 77
3. French Toast – moved to 33 from 51
4. Breakfast – moved to 25 from 42
5. Slow Cooker – moved to 2 from 17

Top Five Decreasing Search Terms

Higher grocery prices for vegetables, fruit, and rice took their toll this month, driving down searches for dishes using these items. Crock Pot searches also



decreased as users learned by reading the Daily Dish e-newsletter that the site's preferred search term was "Slow Cooker." (Rankings are based on search terms having the biggest drop in searches among the top 100 search terms since April 29, 2008.)

1. Salads – moved to 57 from 19
2. Crock Pot – moved to 84 from 62
3. Smoothies – moved to 95 from 76
4. Broccoli – moved to 89 from 71
5. Rice – moved to 43 from 27

May Recipe Favorites – The Top Three Most-Viewed Recipes

Convenience and working parents go hand-in-hand with Slow Cooker recipes, which can't be beaten for easy, weeknight suppers.
